Course Title and Description

PS-311 Spiritual Warfare 30 Hours, 3 Credits (Mondays 8:05-10:00pm)

This course is a teaching on one distinct level of Spiritual Warfare known as "Deliverance." This class will increase your knowledge in the area of bringing freedom to those who are bound by demons. This course will teach, equip, and encourage the student to learn dynamics of deliverance and become better prepared in spiritual warfare.

This course will make you more knowledgeable of the enemy and will help the Believer to be better equipped with the weapons and authority that the Lord has given you to defeat the enemy. One key aspect of this course is that it is centered on Jesus Christ. Without Jesus, there is NO deliverance.

Performance Objectives

- 1. Learn to recognize, discern and get victory over the battles each believer has in the Body of Christ.
- 2. Learn the weapons of spiritual warfare and how to use them.
- 3. Learn the principles of spiritual protection through prayer, worship and fasting.
- 4. Learn how to prepare yourself for Deliverance ministry

Grading Criteria

- 1. Two exams (worth 100 points each) are scheduled for the quarter. There will be a midterm and a final written exam. Study questions will be given one week before the exam.
- You will be responsible to read both texts and any additional reading that may be assigned. This counts for 50 points of your course grade. A reading schedule is supplied in the syllabus.
- 3. You will be required to keep a journal about the various revelations the Lord has shown you in Spiritual Warfare, including areas of deliverance you have experienced yourself and/or seen others experience. I will not be collecting your journal, however, I want to see how much you have documented at the Midterm. You will then turn in a 3-4 page paper sharing your experience in the class. This paper counts for 100 points of your course grade. Due March 29th, 2021 (last day of class).
- 4. You will find a newspaper article, magazine article, television event, or online information on a topic related to a spiritual event in our world today. The article must be evidenced by the need of spiritual and Biblical intervention (article must be approved by instructor). You will share the article and cite where the information was found with a brief summary, typed and turned in the day of your presentation. We will hear from each of you February 15th after the Midterm in class. As soon as you have your article, let me know. This will count for 25 points of your course grade.
- 5. Class Discussion/Participation is worth 50 points.
